areas are defined by the careful use of a low, curved wall and changes in floor materials, with the shapes being reflected above by sweeping, curved bulkheads.

Just inside the back door leading to the pool area is a powder room and guest bathroom, providing convenient shower facilities.

Reconstituted limestone blocks provide an attractive outdoor dining area overlooking the pool and landscaped rock garden.

John says the original pool was modified to fit in with the new house.

A barrel-vaulted canopy covers the rectangular-shaped pool, spa and waterfall. Cantilevered supports with acrylic edges allow an element of privacy.

The family's sizeable collection of framed prints and photographs created a need for plenty of

hanging space throughout the house.

A curved, wrought-iron staircase with a laminated sheoak balustrade leads to the second storey, which houses four bedrooms and two bathrooms.

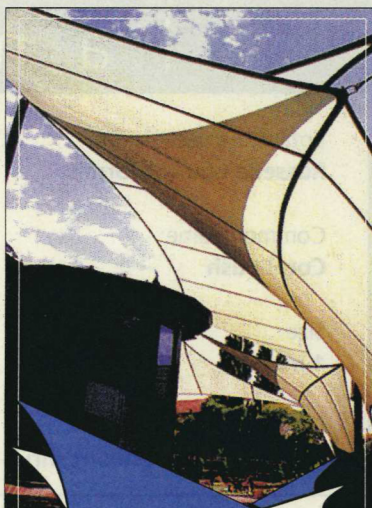
Noeline says they wanted large bedrooms for the children so they could incorporate purpose-designed cabinets, storage and study areas in the future.

With its panoramic views, the open-style master bedroom was planned so "(we) could lie in bed and look at the ocean", says Adrian.

Its bathroom features a double shower, raised spa bath and large walk-in wardrobe.
